Achievements and Performance

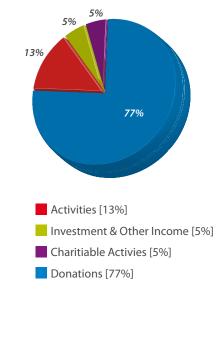
- In the year to 31 December 2011, Barretstown served 2,113 (1,792 in 2010) children and family members through its spring, summer and autumn programmes.
- Barretstown piloted a Bereavement Reunion camp for families who had previously participated in the bereavement programme. This proved a huge success and will remain as one of our programme offerings in 2012.
- Development commenced for a new Multi-Purpose Activity Centre which will allow Barretstown to offer additional activities and become less weather dependent.
- We welcomed our 21,000th camper in September and marked this with a successful campaign to get 21,000 fans on our Facebook page.
- We obtained funding to pilot a Hospital Outreach Programme which will take place in conjunction with Alder Hey Hospital based in Liverpool early in 2012 with a view to expanding into a number of Irish hospitals towards the end of 2012.
- Our residential camps were delivered with the vital support of a total of 753 Camp Volunteers and 28 Medical Volunteers during 2011. In addition to volunteers donating their time to work with the children and families, Barretstown also has the support of many volunteers who offer their services to improve the facility, raise funds, raise awareness and promote Barretstown across Europe.

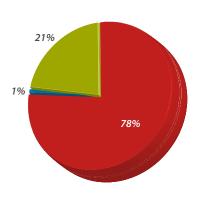
