We talked to his mum and dad, Paola and Karl, about the impact of Barretstown since their first family camp. And how excited Darragh is about his next solo step forward, thanks to supporters like you.



A magical break away...

Darragh was at one of his lowest points, six months into his Leukaemia treatment, when we were invited to attend a family camp at Barretstown. It was incredible. Life changing!

He came away a completely different child. It gave his shattered confidence the biggest boost. And from singing and dancing, to games popping balloons, and the camaraderie – it brought him back. It allowed our child, to just be a child again.

When he left, he just felt so much more comfortable in himself. He didn't really wear his hat anymore. He didn't care about covering up his bald head. He felt stronger and knew he wasn't on his own.

They did a puppet show in front of the whole class, helping them understand

what Darragh was going through and how to help him. They adored it!! And it meant so much to Darragh.

Darragh is now at the end of his three-anda-half-year treatment, and beyond excited to be getting ready for his first solo camp.

Cancer is cruel. It throws children into such an adult world, stealing so much of the joy and magic of childhood. In one way it makes them grow up too fast. And yet, in another way, it prevents it by taking their independence away.

BARRETSTOWN MAGIC REACHES UP AND OUT

New Adolescent Young Adult (AYA) Programme launches!



Many young adults affected by serious illness can have a particularly difficult time as they find themselves stuck between two worlds – too old for childhood services, too young for adult ones. Our newly devised AYA Programme provides support at this pivotal time in their lives - with fun therapeutic recreation-based activities and specialised education workshops. We'd our first hugely successful trial last November and this year will see 3 weekend programmes delivered.





New Residential Transition Year Programme rolls out!

An exciting new Residential Transition Year Programme has been launched. The 4 night residential programmes takes place on our 500-acre campus, welcoming 25+ students to experience what life is like for children affected by serious illness and learn about Barretstown's life changing therapeutic programmes. The programme covers a broad scope of content to meet the needs of TY students and takes the Department of Education's criteria into account, offering students an opportunity to learn new skills and experience a little Barretstown magic.



Two critical Outreach Programmes tackle isolation...

Our Outreach Programmes provide the opportunity to bring the magic of Barretstown beyond our castle gates, to hospitals, schools and communities around Ireland.

Hospital Outreach Programme (HOP)

From Cork, to Belfast, we bring the magic of Barretstown to the bedside of children in hospital and to outpatient clinics. By offering unique, creative and developmentally appropriate activities and interactions, we help to restore joy and laughter in a time often laden with fear, stress and uncertainty.

School Outreach Programme

Barretstown's School Outreach Programme brings the magic of Barretstown to a child's school. The programme aims to create a fun, interactive and child-friendly approach to explaining a serious illness to the class whilst dispelling myths associated with it. This is a free programme that encourages children to be supportive of their classmate and reduces the likelihood of bullying, exclusion, confusion or anxiety. The programme fosters connections and understanding in a uniquely fun Barretstown way.

A journey from camper to volunteer.

This summer, we are so excited to be welcoming a new (but familiar) face to our volunteer team -Ashleigh Kiernan! We first met Ashleigh when she was 9-years old and in the midst of a gruelling battle with Leukaemia. And we count ourselves so lucky to have her amazing, bubbly personality join us now as a Cara volunteer!

Cancer steals the fun from childhood...

When I was younger, I was a total chatterbox but that changed when I got sick. I became much quieter and missed out on the child part of childhood. The fun disappeared.

I attended my first camp when I was eight years old and I always use the analogy of a battery when talking about my first camp. It was like I went down to camp as a dead battery and came back fully charged. I was talking again, I was laughing. It was like magic...I was me again.

When you go to Barretstown you catch up on all the fun you missed out on. The activities, all the Caras - it's just pure happiness down there. You make so many friends in similar situations and get to do all these activities you don't usually do in normal day to day life.

Barretstown has seen me grow over the last 11 years and I have seen it develop and grow too. I have been on such a journey with Barretstown and I know it will only continue with some of the best moments still to come.

Leaving a legacy of magic behind!

Brenda is a paediatric nurse practitioner who since 1997 has been making the epic journey from Seattle in the United States to our campus in Co. Kildare to volunteer at The Med Shed for summer camps at Barretstown. She spoke to us about why she's decided to leave a gift in her Will to make sure the Serious Fun and magic of camp lives on.

Where the magic began...

It was back in the Summer of 1995 or 1996, when I was nursing in paediatric oncology that I first met a nurse who'd spent a summer at Barretstown. Her experiences inspired me to get in touch with Barretstown. And in the Summer of 1997, I embarked on my first trip to volunteer at camp.

That was it. I was hooked. And have been coming back, to help at the Med-Shed ever since.

It's an epic journey. One year, from the time I left the red door at the castle, to turning the key in my door in Seattle, it was 23.5 hours! But it was worth it. It always is.

You come to camp to help, but you end up getting so much more than you give.

A million little reasons...

When asked why I do it – what my favourite thing is – there's no one reason.

It's a million little ones that combine to create this truly magical experience, that will forever hold a piece of my heart and soul.

There's the setting of the magical medieval castle. The country of Ireland and its incredible people. And the unbelievable staff and volunteers in Barretstown.

You experience the best of humanity where kindness is found at every turn. People from all over the world who give up a week of their time to put on funny clothes and costumes, paint their faces and wear their clothes backwards – to do whatever it takes to make a child smile.

But most of all, it's the honour and privilege of hearing the laughter for yourself. Being one of the lucky few, to see the magic in action first-hand.

Leaving a legacy of magic behind...

It was a few years ago now, filling in details for an insurance policy at work, that I first thought about leaving something behind me for Barretstown. I've no children myself and I couldn't think of a better beneficiary for my new policy to go to.

Since then, I've added another policy. And made Barretstown one of the main beneficiaries of my overall estate in my will too.

It means a lot to think I'll be helping camps happen long past when I'm not able to come to them physically. To know I'll still be able to help a child get back a part of their childhood again.

And I'd love, if in some small way, sharing my story today inspires someone else to think about leaving a gift too.

Together we can leave a small footprint of ourselves in this magical place where children can be children and raise a little hell at the same time.

Where siblings are never forgotten

Madi attended our first sibling camp after reopening. She's big sister to Isaac, who you may remember reading about. He suffers from a rare, undiagnosed genetic condition that's led to him being in and out of hospital since the day he was born. Here, mum Ashley, talks about how much Barretstown means to Madi.


Some serious responsibility...

My wee boy Isaac's condition means he has a severely compromised immune system and gets ill very easily.

He has been in and out of hospital since birth – with everything from pneumonia to meningitis and swine flu.

During the pandemic, I think a lot of people experienced what it's like to live in fear of passing something on and making a vulnerable loved one very ill.

That's been most of Madi's life. Before covid ever hit.





Did you know? At Barretstown we have a special 6-day summer camp designed just for siblings aged between 7 - 17, who have a brother or sister who are being treated for, or are recovering from, a serious illness.

A special understanding...

The Caras and teams care for the child not only physically but emotionally. They are so kind and respectful to what these siblings are going through. And how pause has been pressed on their childhood too.

Madi just adores sibling camp. She's met friends who are walking the same life path as her. Children she can really connect with about her emotions and feelings around life, with a sibling who has complex needs.

Friends who understand what it's like to have to be left with relatives all the time as parents care for their sick sibling. Or what it's like to have to be so careful of bugs and germs all the time.

Having some serious fun...

Sibling camp at Barretstown is just absolutely fantastic. It's a place where the sibling of the sick child gets to have their own respite and fun. And the attention they need and deserve.

They no longer have to take a step back while everyone's focused in on the care of their sibling. At these camps it's all about them. And only them.

It gives stability, structure and a welcome break.

And as parents it's so amazing to know Madi is being looked after so exceptionally well. That she is getting to enjoy activities freely with friends. That she's centre stage for a change.

Thank you for supporting Barretstown and making these sibling camps happen. They are as important as the main family and summer camps - maybe even more so. Because as Madi says...
